

## COVID-19 code of conduct

This code of conduct outlines the expectations that we have of our staff and parents/carers when continuing to access our nurseries during the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak.

We will...	Parents/carers will...
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Role model good hygiene such as good, regular handwashing after intimate care, mealtimes, and when entering the nursery, ensuring children also do this</li> <li>• Take temperatures of all staff daily</li> <li>• Monitor and record all cleaning undertaken</li> <li>• Keep surfaces clear and tidy, and regularly clean these</li> <li>• Regularly clean door handles, light switches, and communal equipment such as tablets</li> <li>• Wear suitable personal protective equipment when necessary</li> <li>• Keep a safe distance from other staff and adults</li> <li>• Work carefully and sympathetically to supervise and care for children according to their needs and age whilst having regard for keeping a safe distance</li> <li>• Provide an environment where children are less likely to infect each other</li> <li>• Utilise the entire internal and external floorspace of the nursery to promote keeping a safe distance, and provide activities to teach children this as appropriate</li> <li>• Provide basic handovers at the end of each day with full details on the Blossom learning journey platform</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Practice and role model good hygiene at home and when outside of the house</li> <li>• Help children to practice good hygiene</li> <li>• Follow all instructions as to which entrance to use to drop off and collect your child</li> <li>• Wear a face covering when dropping off or picking up your child and when visiting the nursery</li> <li>• Queue appropriately outside the nursery at pick up and drop off times, leaving a safe distance from other parents/carers</li> <li>• Support staff at collection times by patiently waiting for your child to be collected or returned at the main door</li> <li>• Use either telephone or electronic communication as frequently as possible to keep the nursery team updated with any necessary information about your child, as the opportunity to share information face to face will be more limited</li> <li>• Not send any games or toys from home with children to nursery</li> <li>• Not leave any bags, buggies, scooters, car seats and so on at nursery</li> <li>• Inform the nursery team of any illness that your child may have, and adhere to the self-isolation measures as directed by the government</li> </ul>

**If any staff member or child displays COVID-19 symptoms, they cannot attend nursery and must self-isolate as per latest guidance.**
